Hope everyone is happy and healthy! COVID continues to be forefront in our daily lives. Stanislaus County has moved into the "red" tier but our infection rate still will not permit us to move into the "orange" tier. However, the State is still moving to a reopening on June 15th. We need to stay vigilant so the State does not have a reason to postpone reopening. However, we are moving towards reopening of City Hall effective June 1st. You are still encouraged to continue to make payments and complete various applications as you are currently, but you can come in and complete those tasks at our counter June 1st.

I know many of you have received or are in process of receiving your COVID vaccine. But many more of you have not done so. We are trying to make it convenient and we are working to get another mobile clinic in Waterford. But I would not wait and you can schedule a vaccine appointment at the county website at Vaccine Information - Coronavirus - HSA - Stanislaus County (schsa.org) for vaccination information and locations of vaccination clinics.

I know many of you have been hit hard through lost or reduced wages. We continue to work to find ways to provide assistance. Stanislaus County continues to allocated funding for those that meet certain income requirements by offering help for those behind on their rent and utility payments. Public Works

- <u>Main Street Reconstruction -</u> The project is in construction. The project will add missing sidewalk and provide reconstruction of the roadway from Church Street to G Street and provide a pot hole free smooth and safe roadway.
- 2021 Slurry and Cape Seal Over the last two years, the city has made a concerted effort to maintain our street network. Three separate slurry seal projects were completed on approximately 40% of our road network adding 7-10 additional years of life to those streets. A slurry seal is a relatively inexpensive maintenance application which keeps good streets in good condition so they do not deteriorate to a point where a much more expensive repair is needed. The 2021 Slurry and Cape Seal project is out to bid and will be the largest project yet at nearly \$1,000,000. The project will be funded with Measure L, a Countywide special sales tax for road maintenance purposes.
- Citywide Watering Schedule -
 - Outdoor watering is prohibited daily from 11:00 am 7:00 pm.
 - Odd-numbered addresses watering days are Wednesday, Friday and Sunday.
 - o Even-numbered addresses watering days are Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.
 - No outdoor water use on Monday.

Fall and Winter are a great time turn your sprinkler clocks off and let nature water your landscape and save you money by lowering your water consumption.

Waterford Police Services was very honored to participate in the recent Love Waterford event. It was great to see all those who volunteered their time to help complete projects around town and more importantly get to know one another as a community. I am happy to announce we are in the early planning staged for National Night Out 2021, which as things on the COVID front continue to improve, we are planning for August at Beard Park. Traffic is still a major concern in Waterford, and the deputies assigned to Waterford Police Services have been out looking for speeders, red light runners, stop sign runners and those who may need some remedial education on their driving skills. Our goal is to educate first and enforce when needed to ensure our roadways are safe for all. We recently had two of our assigned deputies attend radar/Lidar school and they are now certified to operate our radar Lidar equipment for speed enforcement.

As we quickly roll into the summer months, I want to encourage everyone to be cautious when spending a day in River Park or attending one of our local reservoirs. On a hot day the water looks inviting, but keep in mind there are hidden dangers under the water. Use extreme caution when in the water and make sure the little ones are wearing a life jacket.
