Public Works

- <u>Main Street Reconstruction</u> The project to add missing sidewalk and provide reconstruction of the roadway from Church Street to G Street is nearing completion. Take a look if you are in the area.
- <u>2021 Slurry and Cape Seal -</u> Over the last two years, the city has made a concerted effort to maintain our street network. Three separate slurry seal projects were completed on approximately 40% of our road network adding 7-10 additional years of life to those streets. A slurry seal is a relatively inexpensive maintenance application which keeps good streets in good condition so they do not deteriorate to a point where a much more expensive repair is needed. The 2021 Slurry and Cape Seal project is in construction and will be the largest project yet at nearly \$750,000. The project will be funded with Measure L, a Countywide special sales tax for road maintenance purposes.
